When you think of Superior Performance, you have to think of Teri Haefke. She has won seven state titles, had the high average in the state for seven consecutive years, 2002-09, and had the high average in the nation on three occasions.

Her seven state championship titles are; Ohio USBC WBA Queens, 2004, 2006 and 2012. She was the first lady to win these titles three times. She was the Ohio Championship Tournament All Events Actual winner in 2006 with a 2134, and again in 2007 with a 2170. She was a member of the Ohio Championship Tournament Team Actual in 2006 and Ohio Championship Tournament Doubles Actual in 2007.

Teri's high average in the nation awards were earned during the 2002-03 season with a 238, the 2008-09 season with a 239 and the 2010-11 season with a 242.

Her highest average was attained during the 2010-2011 season which was a 242. She has had over a 200 plus average for fifteen years. She has had over forty 300 games and over twenty 800 plus series. She threw two 300 games back to back on February 24, 2014. She has had over three hundred seventy 700 plus series.

Teri was the Professional Women's Bowling Association Regional Rookie of the Year in 2000. She won the PWBA Johnstown, PA Open in 2003, was fifth in the PWBA Regional Berkley Springs WV Open, was first in the Full Circle Sports Mixed Doubles in 2002, second in 2011 and was first in the Full Circle Sports Trio in 2011. She won the TNBA Reed-Hawthorne in 2011.

She was a member of the Ohio USBC WBA All Stars in 2007 and 2008 and the Ohio USBC WBA Bowler of the Year in 2012.

She has been the champion of the Youngstown Women's Masters, the Warren Women's Masters and the Summit County Queens in both 2011 and 2012.

Teri is a member of the Youngstown-Salem USBC WBA and has won in her local tournament the doubles actual in 1999, 2000, 2004, 2007, 2008, and 2011. She was the actual all events winner in 2000, 2003, 2006, 2007, 2011, and 2012. She won the singles actual in 2006, 2011 and 2012. She was a member of the actual winning team in 2005, 2008, 2010, 2011 and 2012.

For her many accomplishments, we add the name of Teri Haefke to the rolls of the Ohio USBC Women's Bowling Association Hall of Fame for SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE.
